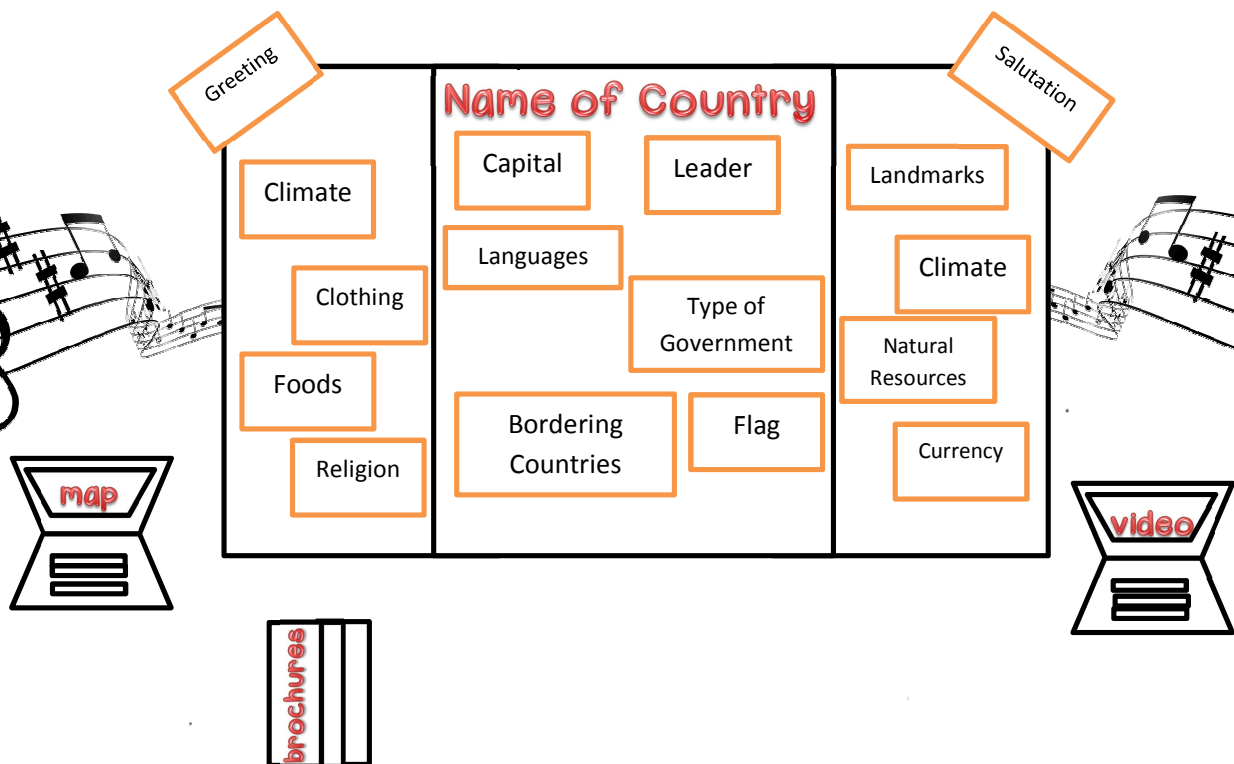
Your display board should include the all of the following about your country:

- Location
- Climate-average rainfall: average temperature in winter, spring, summer, and fall; when are their seasons?
- Traditional clothing
- Religion most observed
- Traditional foods
- Celebrations/Rituals
- Official language, or if there is more than one spoken
- Type of government
- Flag
- What is the capital of the country?
- What are the neighboring countries?

- What type of currency do they use?
- Who is the current leader?
- How do they greet each other?

- How do they say good-bye to one another?
- What are some famous landmarks?
- What are some natural resources the country has?

Your board should look appealing to the tourist. Here is an idea of how to set your board.
