Numbered Heads Together

Goals

The Numbered Heads Together activity provides students with opportunities to collaborate in a variety of ways.

Uses

Use Numbered Heads Together as a format to have a quick, collaborative discussion and to promote individual accountability.

Instructional Steps

- 1. Divide students into groups of four. (Note: group size will vary depending on student needs and lesson modifications.)
- 2. Ask students in each group number off from one to four.
- 3. Ask students to discuss a topic, answer review questions, or complete an academic task in their groups.
- 4. Ensure that groups understand that each member of the group must be able to discuss the topic, answer the question(s), or recap the learning from the task if called upon.
- 5. Select a random number (from 1 to 4) corresponding to a number of a group member.
- 6. Assuming the random number selected is 4, select one or two of the students who numbered off as "4" to discuss/recap the learning. Additional "4" students can also contribute by adding new information to the previous response(s).
