Federal warrants have been issued at Chicago, Illinois, concerning those individuals, charging them with a variety of Federal violations including interstate flight to avoid prosecution, mob action, Antiriot Laws and conspiracy. Some of these individuals were also charged in an indictment returned 7/23/70, at Detriot, Michigan, with conspiracy to violate Federal Bombing and Gan Control Laws.

These individuals should be considered dangerous because of their known advocacy and use of explosives. reported acquisition of firearms and incendiary devices, and known propensity for violence.
