Pronoun Rules

Rule 1: A speaker should mention himself or herself after mentioning another person.

Example: Clarissa invited you and me to the party.

Rule 2: Singular pronouns replace singular nouns. Plural pronouns replace plural nouns.

Example: If a student is sick, he or she should stay home.

If those people buy the house, they will move in soon.

Rule 3: Pronouns used after words such as anybody, everyone, someone, nobody,

one, each, either, and neither should be singular.

Example: Each of the girls thought she would win the science fair.
